



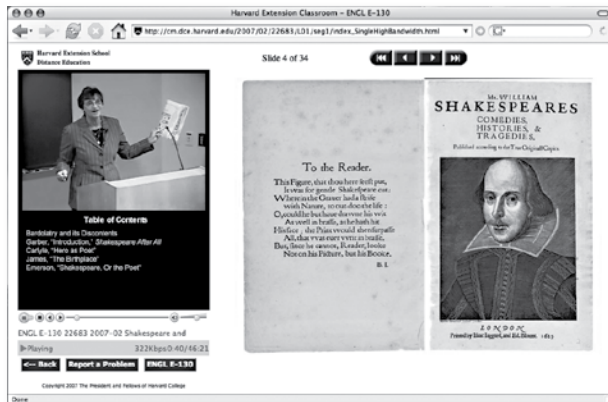
Harvard Distance Education: Take Classes from Anywhere

Convenient and easy to use, distance learning allows anyone with access to the Internet to take a semester-long class from anywhere in the world.

Our students have busy lives, often balancing family life, work, and school. That's why Harvard Extension School offers more than 100 courses online, including Harvard College courses. Take a course to pursue a passion, earn credit toward a degree, or advance your career.

New class lecture videos are available for you to watch weekly. You interact with classmates and instructors through e-mail and online media, and review and complete the scheduled assignments wherever you are most comfortable.

Most of our degree programs allow students to apply credit earned in an online course toward their degree. Please note that none of our degrees can be earned solely online. See the website to learn about residency requirements and additional distance education policies.

After registering for a distance education course, you will receive a registration confirmation. This will include your Harvard University ID number, which you will need, along with your Harvard University PIN, to view password-protected videos throughout the semester.

At www.extension.harvard.edu/DistanceEd review technical requirements, watch sample lectures, and read through academic policies prior to the start of class to be sure that your computer can accommodate a distance learning course and you understand your responsibilities.

For the majority of our distance education courses, you can watch the videos any time of day, but you need to keep up with the course material each week.

Many distance courses have in-class hour, midterm, and final exams. If your primary residence throughout the term is in the 6-state New England area, you are expected to take your exams on campus as scheduled.
